## Accountability Profile

Georgia's Single Statewide Accountability System (SSAS) includes an Accountability Profile for every public school and school system in the state. The Accountability Profile is composed of:

1. An absolute performance determination based on Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).
2. A Performance Index based on annual growth in academic achievement as measured by statewide assessments.
3. Performance Highlights which provide recognition for schools and school systems based on academic related indicators.

This school's performance on the three components is presented below.

### 2) Performance Index

The Performance Index includes two components for each public school that detail the Percentage of Students Meeting and Exceeding Standards and the gain or loss of that percentage from the previous year.

The Governor's Office of Student Achievement (OSA) awards those schools with the Highest Percentage of Students Meeting and Exceeding Standards and/or those with the Greatest Gain in Percentage of Students Meeting and Exceeding Standards.

Criteria were developed comparing the most recent two years of Criterion Referenced Competency Test (CRCT) (grades 1-8 in reading, English/language arts, math, social studies, and science) and/or the Georgia High School Graduation Test (grade 11 first time test takers - English/language arts, math, science, and social studies). Criteria were based on Full Academic Year (FAY) students.

The percentage of Students Meeting and Exceeding Standards in the current year is 94.65%.

This percentage reflects a Gain over the prior year of 0%.

This change was at or above 47.18% of the elementary schools in Georgia.

This school did not meet the 2005 award criteria for Highest Percentage of Students Meeting and Exceeding Standards.

This school did not meet the 2005 award criteria for Greatest Gain in Percentage of Students Meeting and Exceeding Standards.

### 3) Performance Highlights

This information reflects the 2004-2005 State Report Cards data which includes data for all students, not just Full Academic Year (FAY) students. Performance Highlights list the academic measurements for this school that meet or exceed 80%.

Georgia High School Writing Test: 96.4% Percent Meeting and Exceeding Standard

11th Grade - GHSGT Social Studies: 93.77% Percent Meeting and Exceeding Standard

11th Grade - GHSGT Science: 86.13% Percent Meeting and Exceeding Standard

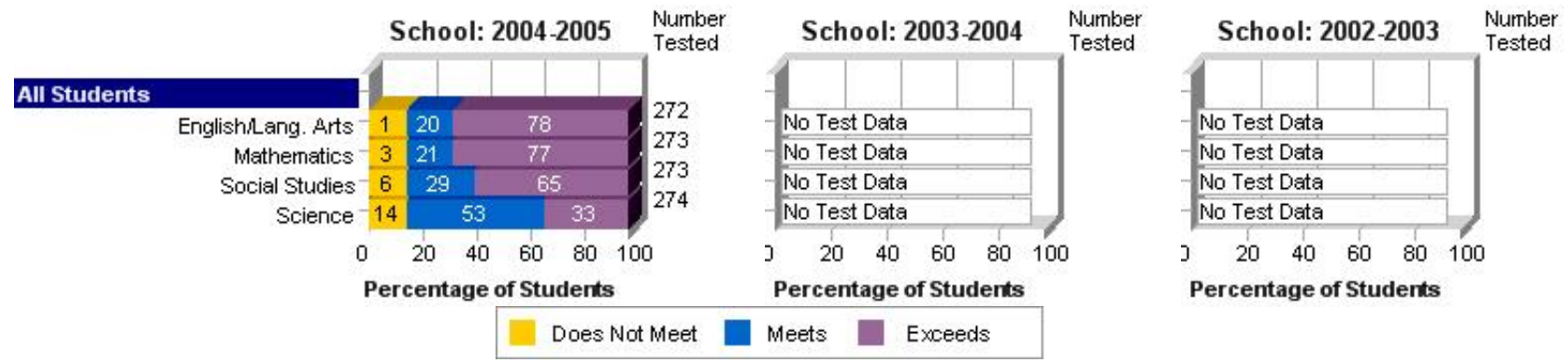

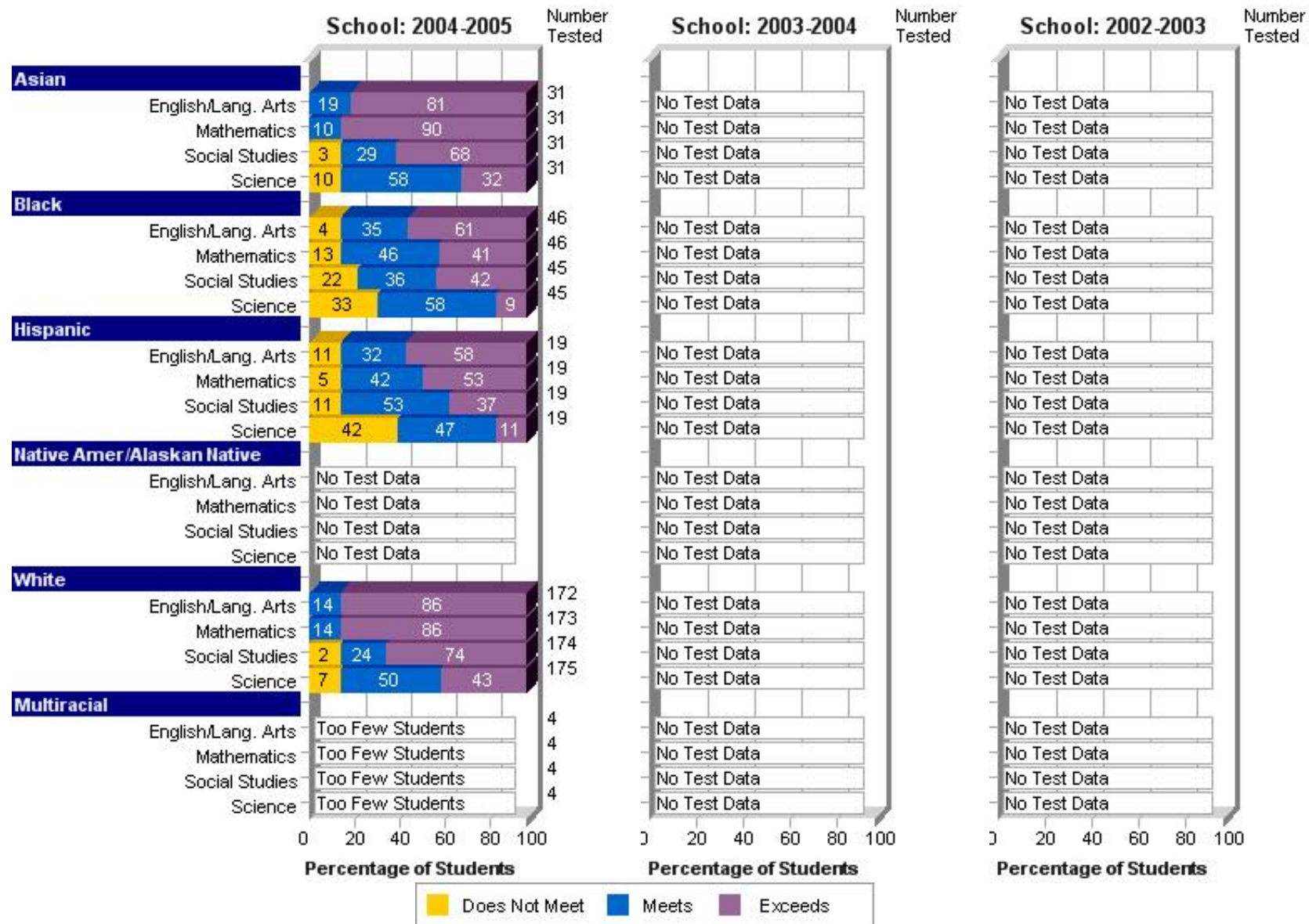

Note: Data reported on special education teachers in 2003-04 were based on the understanding of Highly Qualified Teacher (HQT) requirements for Special Education teachers at that time. Upon clarification from U.S. Department of Education (USED), the Georgia Department of Education (GDOE) has taken immediate steps to revise the data collection system to reflect the current definition. The GDOE has made the necessary modifications to collect and report data for the 2004-05 school year and in the future. GDOE will footnote data for past years on the website, indicating that updated definitions of HQT for Special Education teachers make longitudinal comparisons of HQ data inaccurate for some districts.

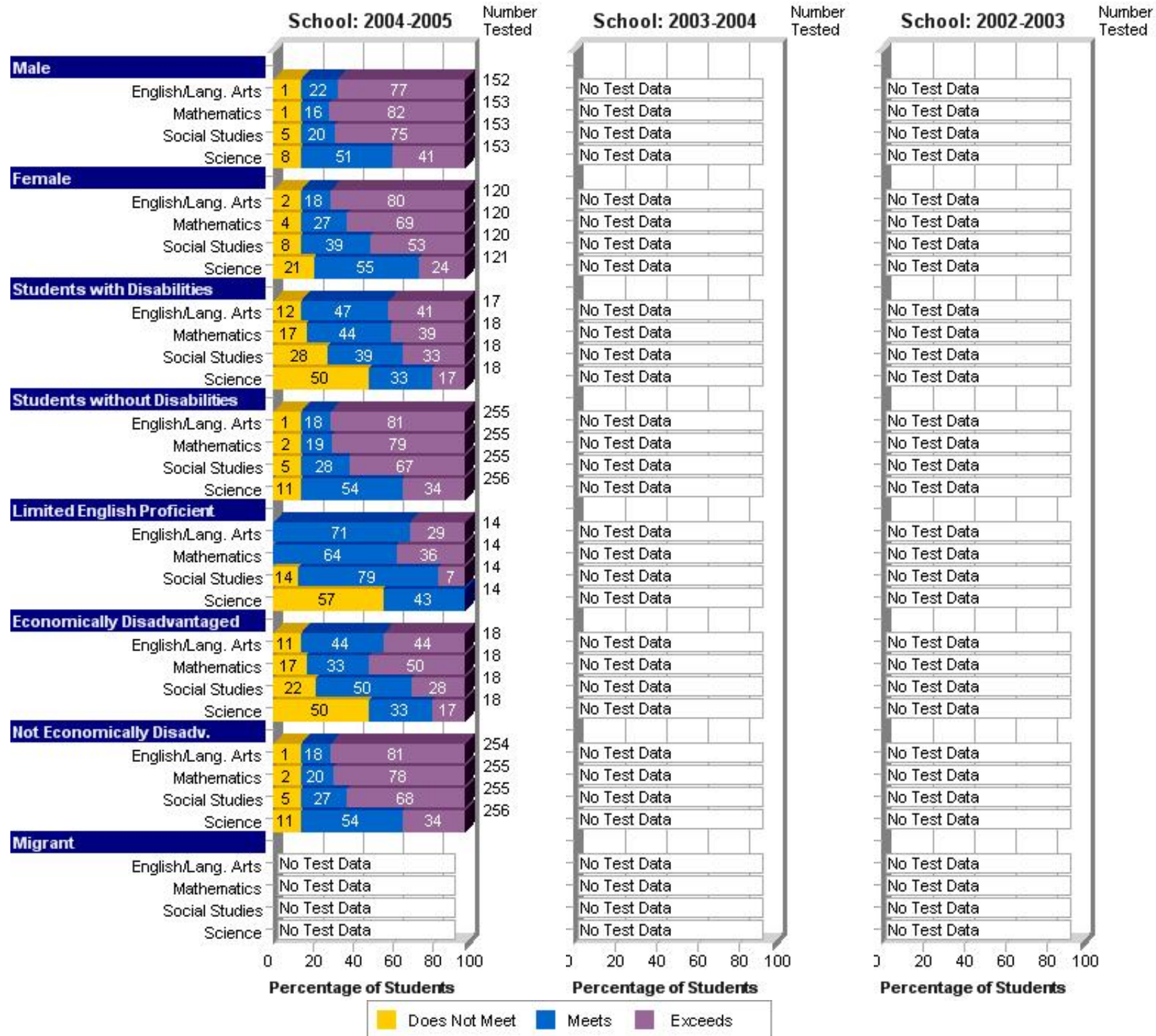

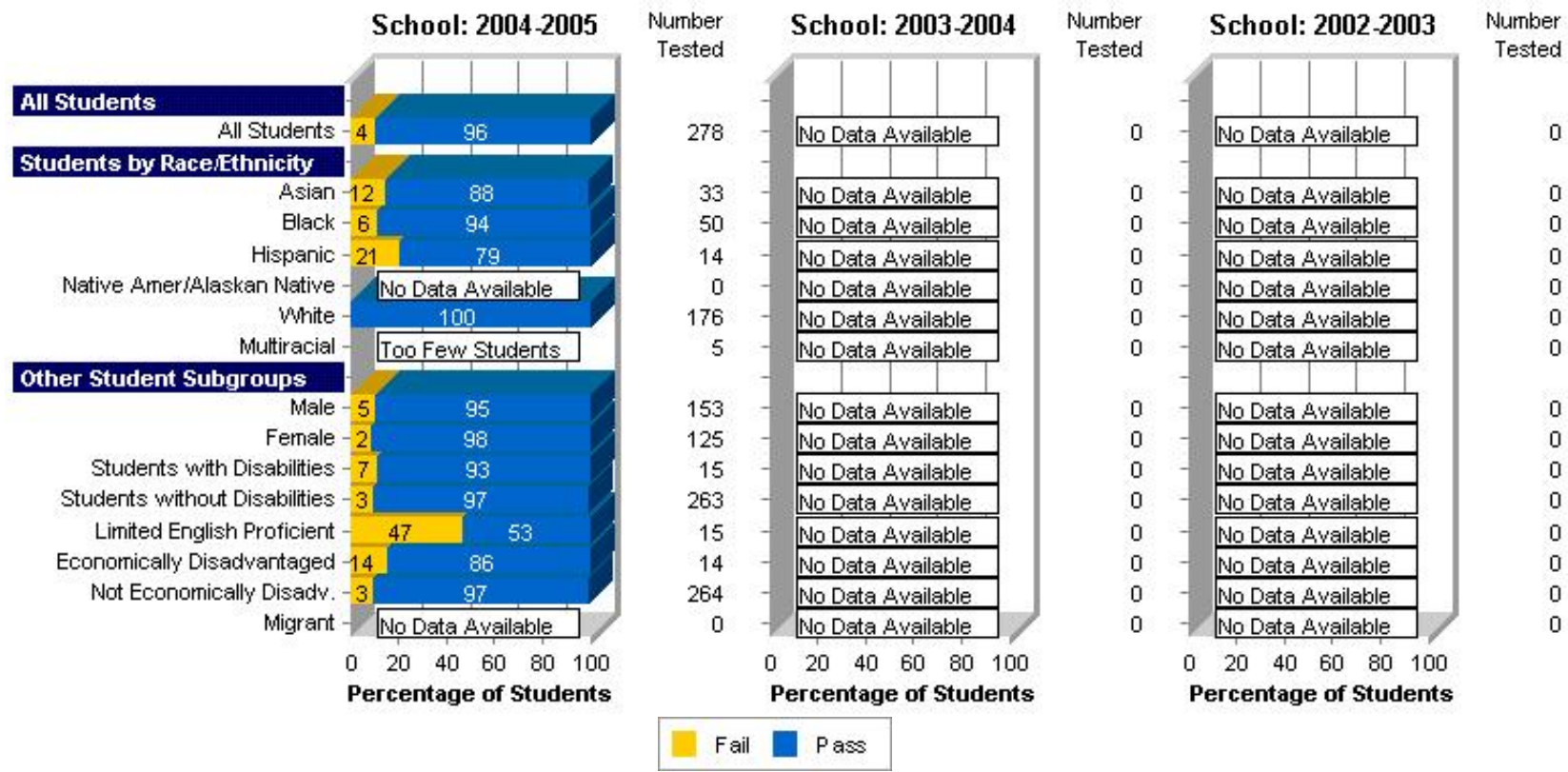

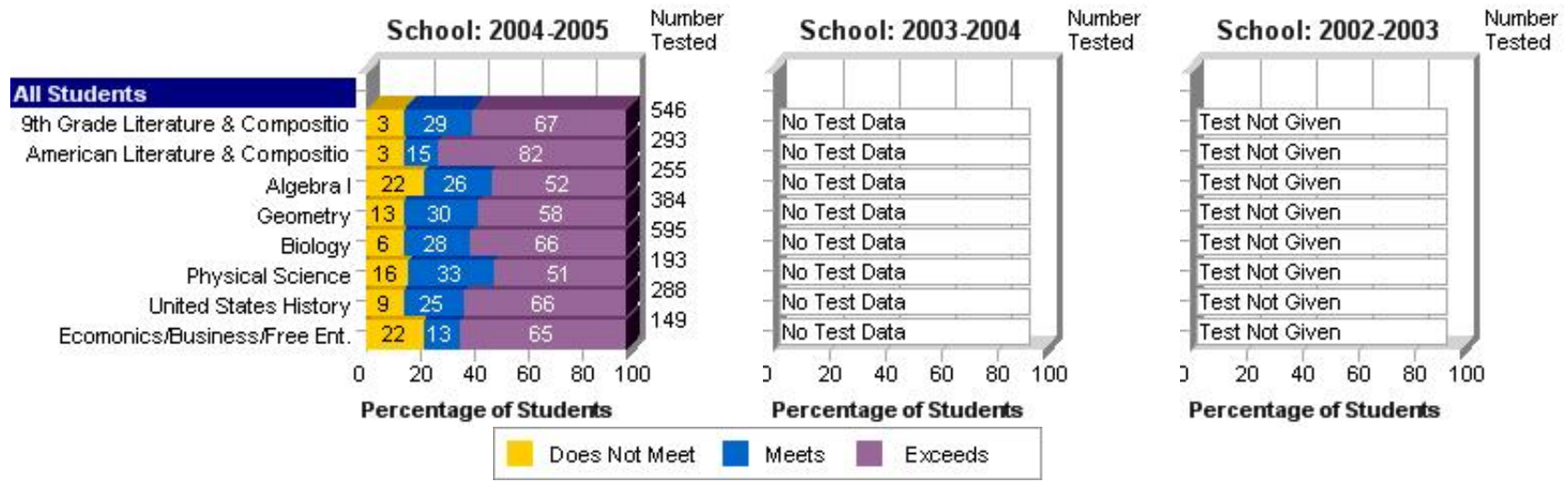
### Percentage of 11th-Grade 1st-Time Test Takers at Each Performance Level: Comparison By Other Subgroups



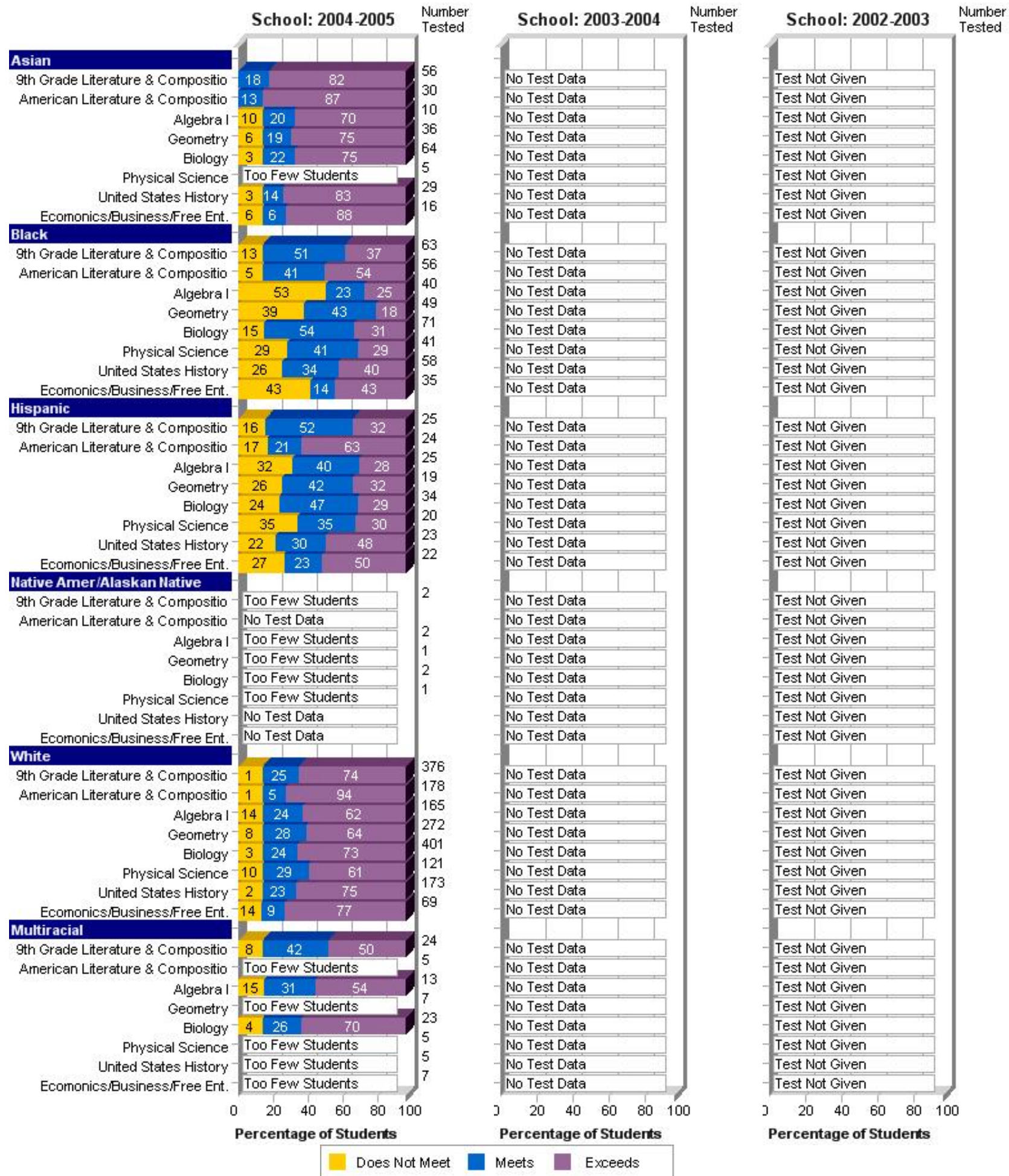
## Georgia High School Writing Test (GHSWT) - Writing Percentage of 11th-Grade 1st-Time Test Takers at Each Performance Level



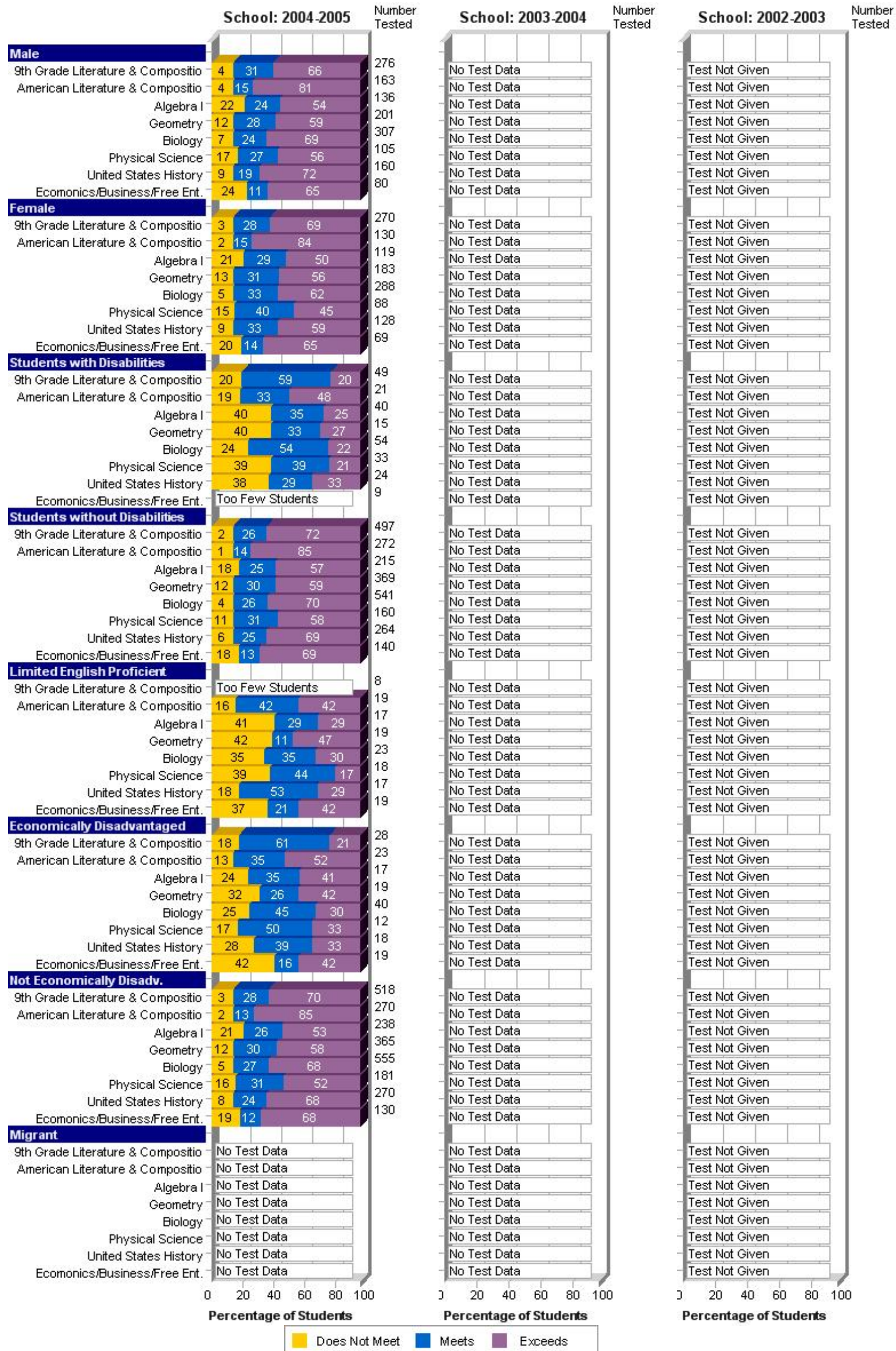

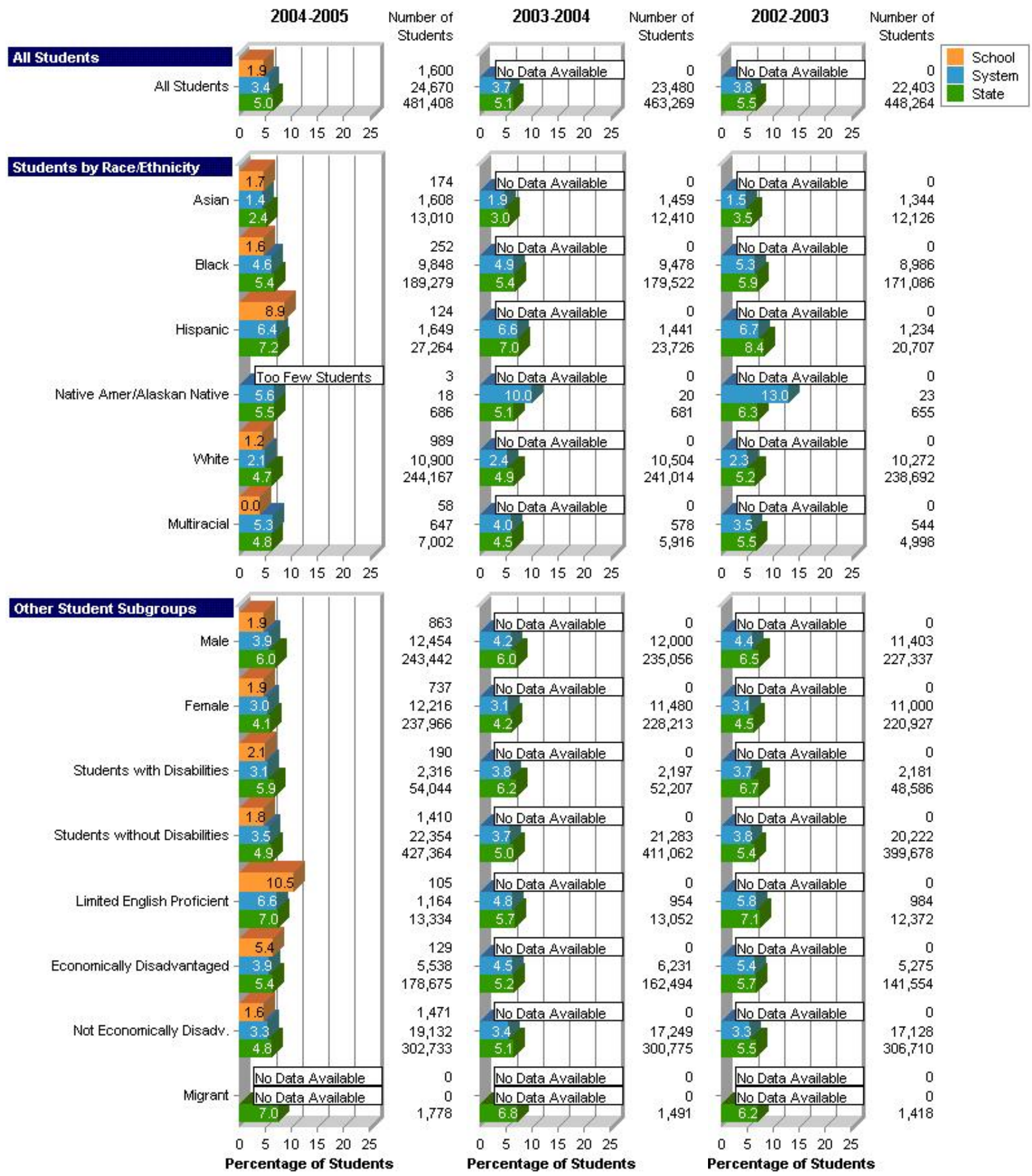

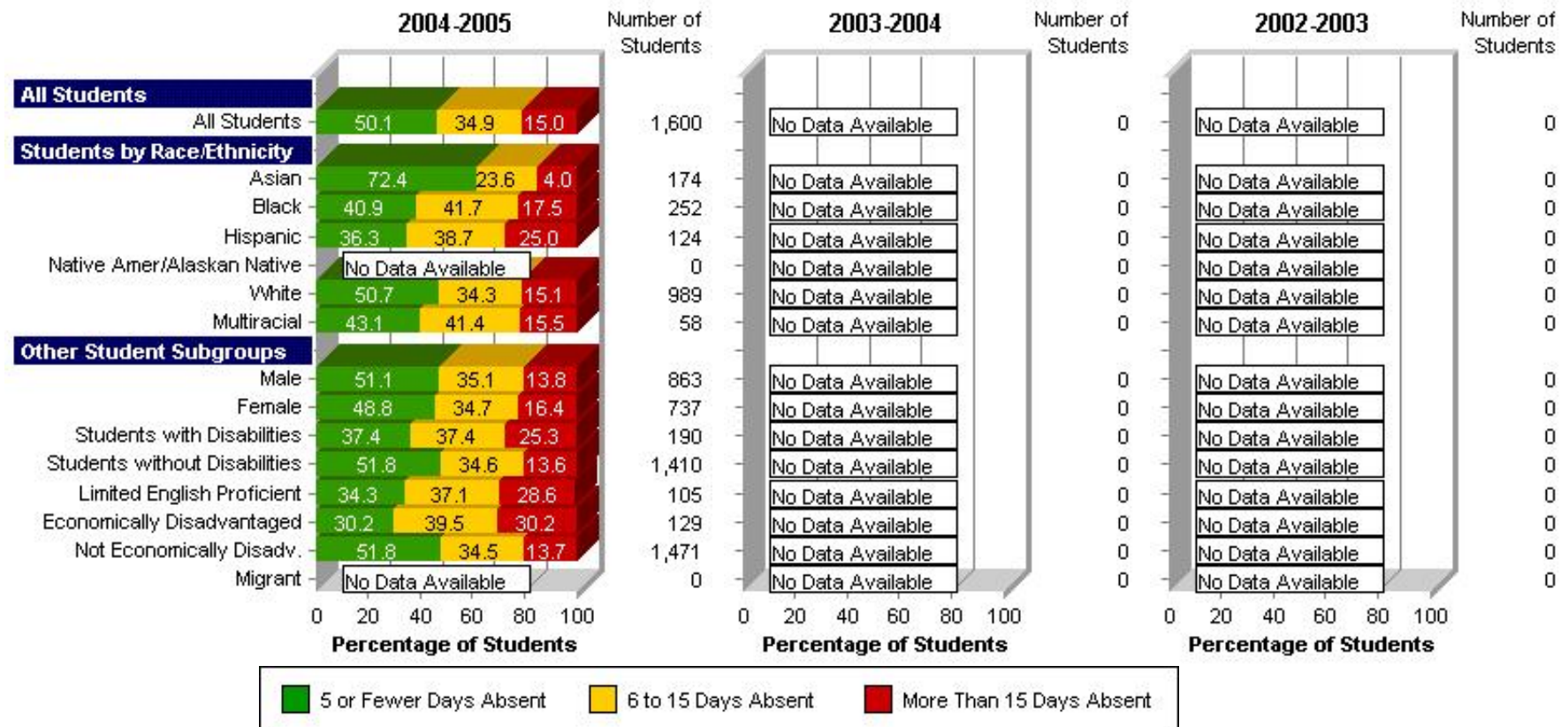

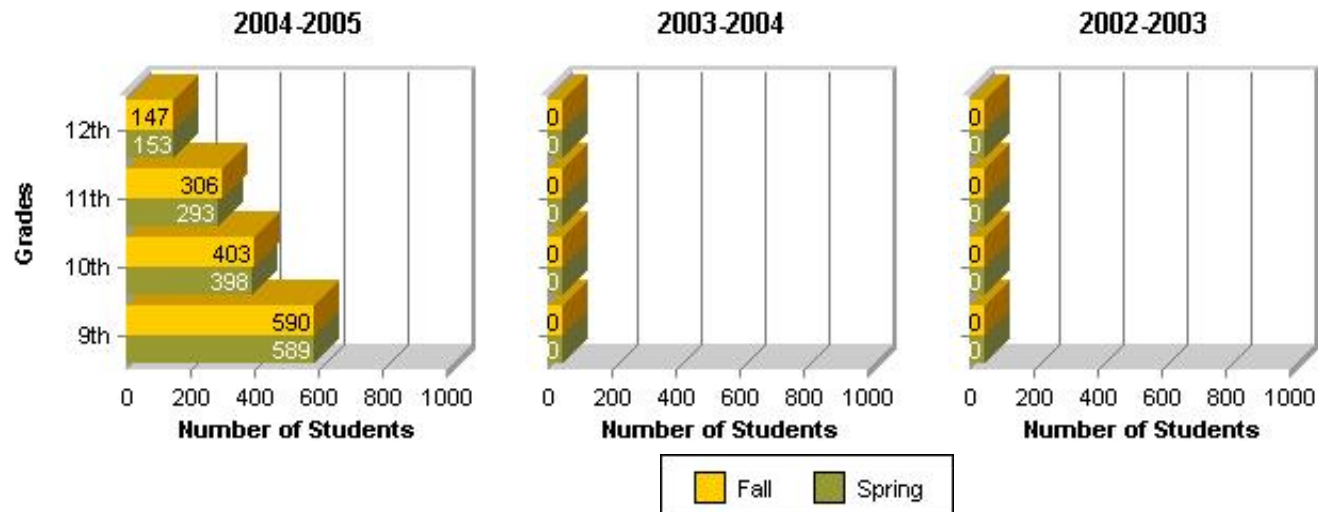

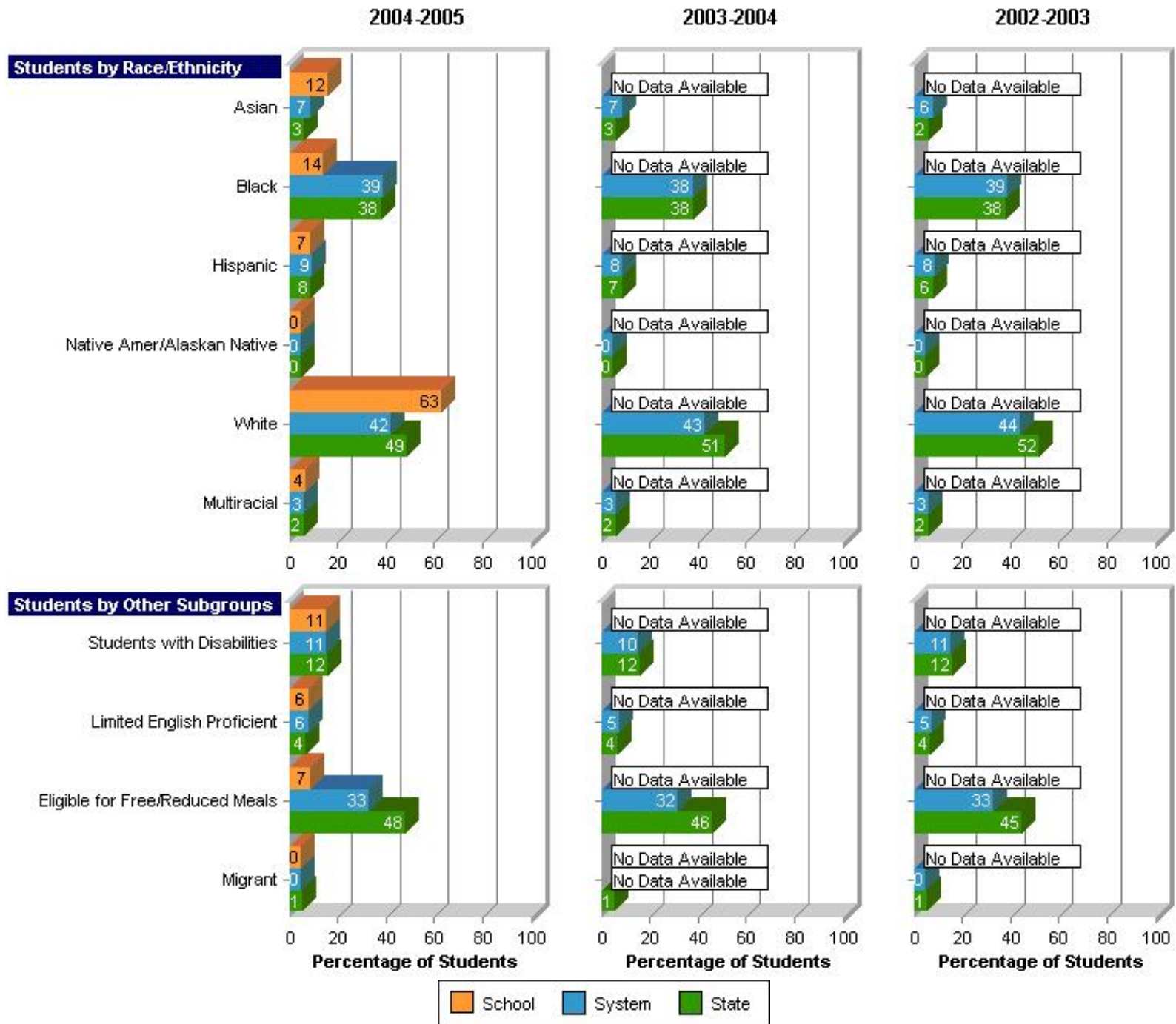

Fall and Spring Enrollment for Three Academic Years

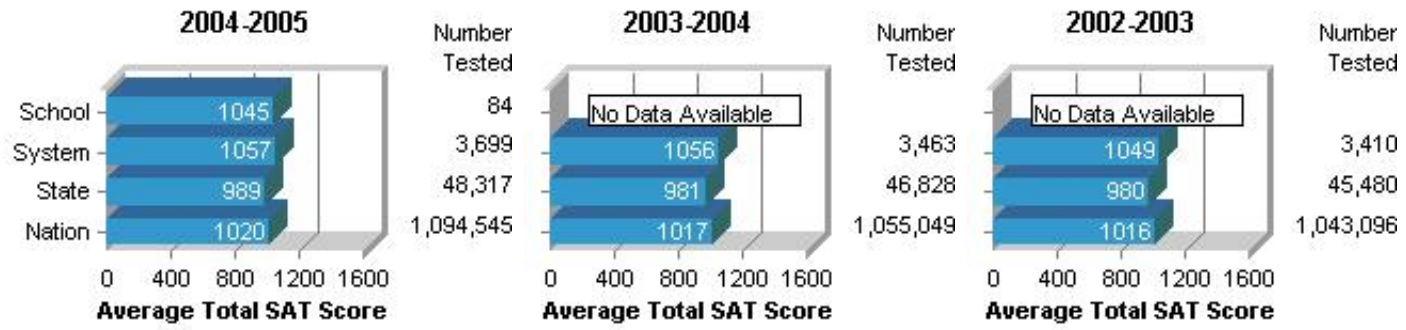


Percentage of Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity & Other Subgroups

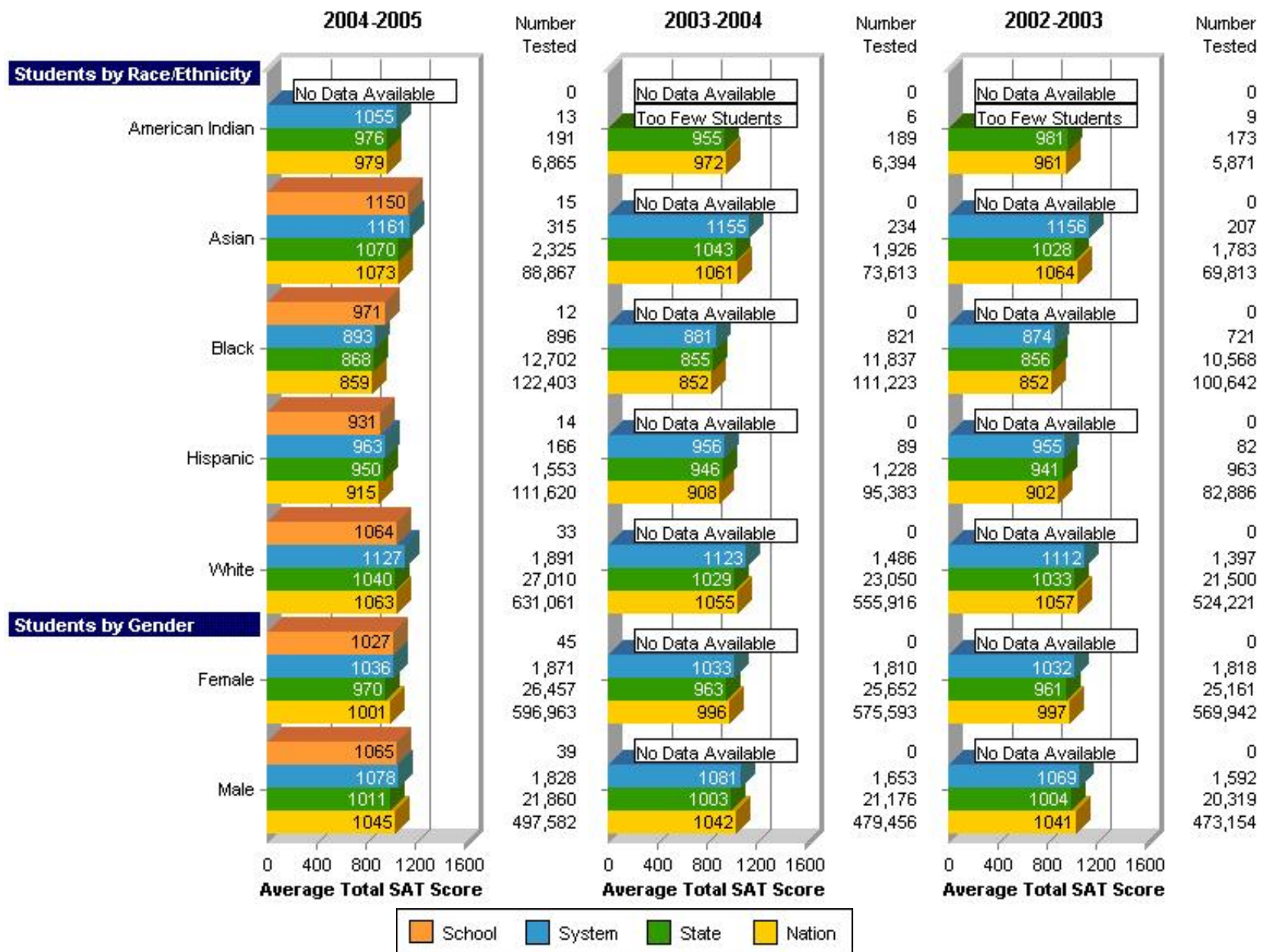




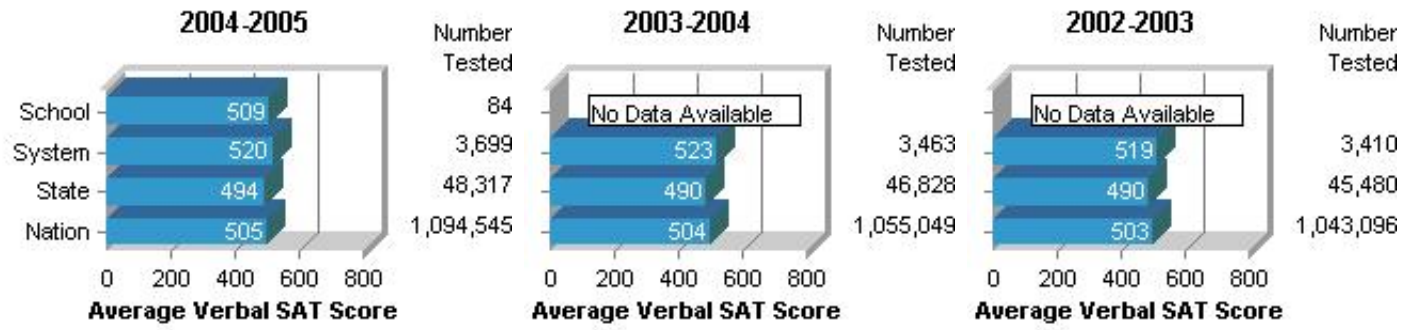
### Average Total SAT Score for High School Seniors (Reflects Most Recent Scores) at the State and National Levels



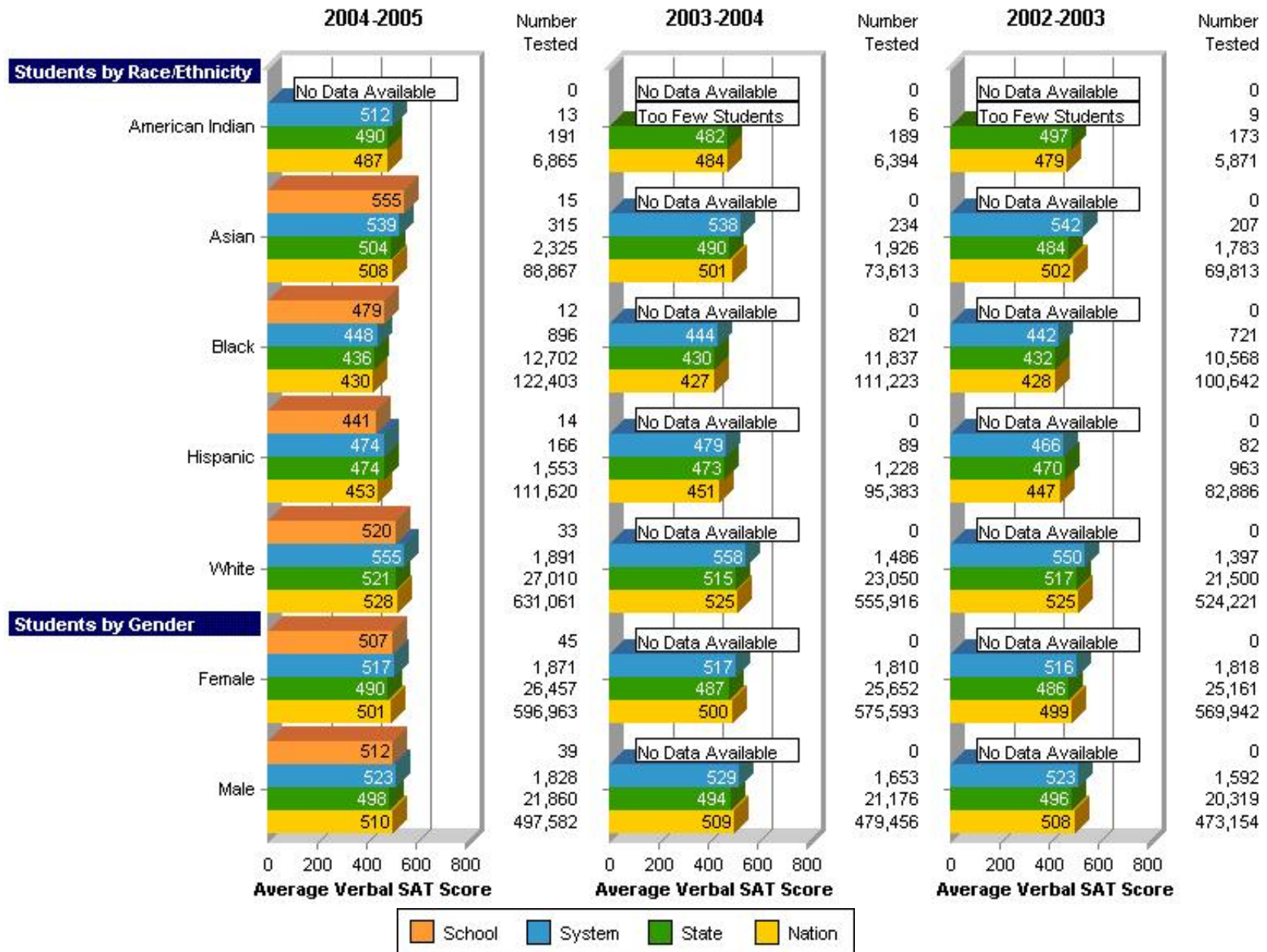
### Average Total SAT Score for High School Seniors by Subgroups (Reflects Most Recent Scores) at the State and National Levels



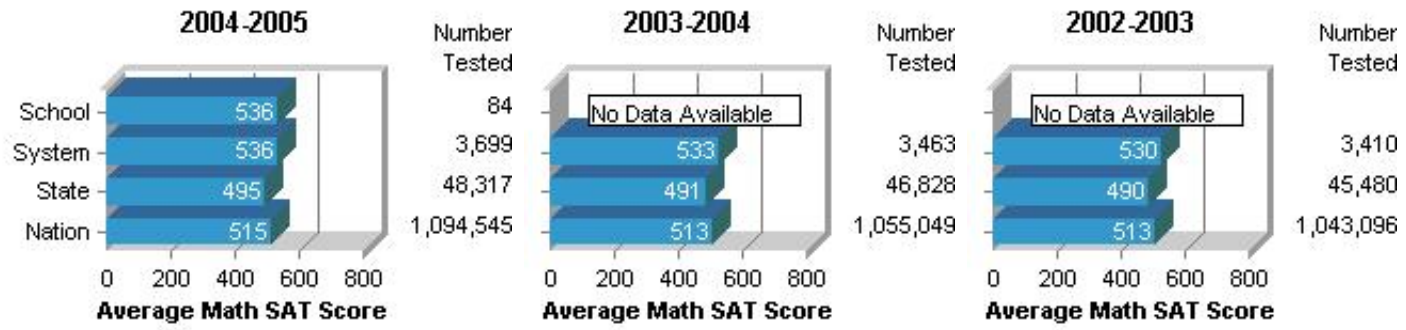
### Average Verbal SAT Score for High School Seniors (Reflects Most Recent Scores) at the State and National Levels



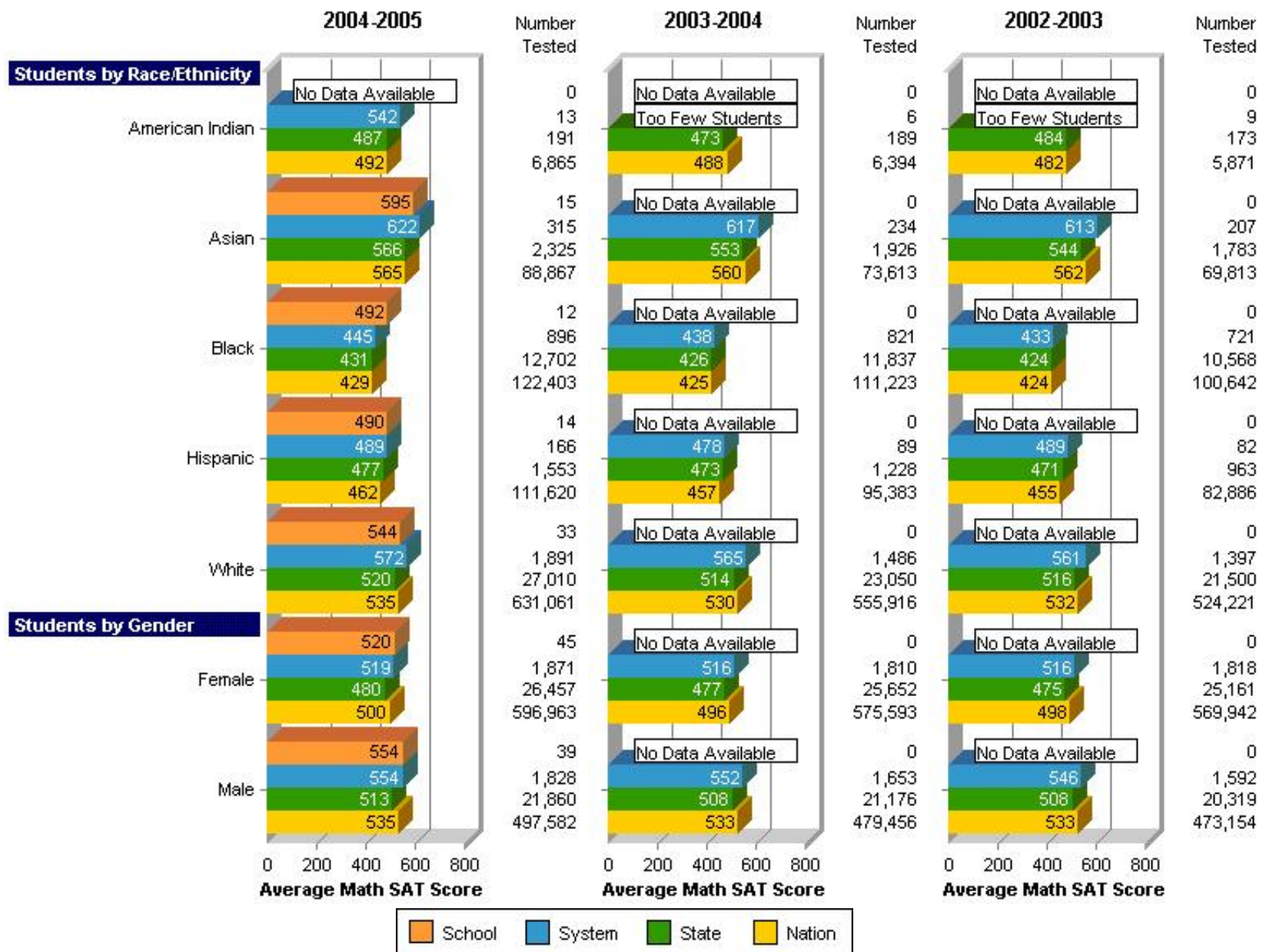
### Average Verbal SAT Score for High School Seniors by Subgroups (Reflects Most Recent Scores) at the State and National Levels



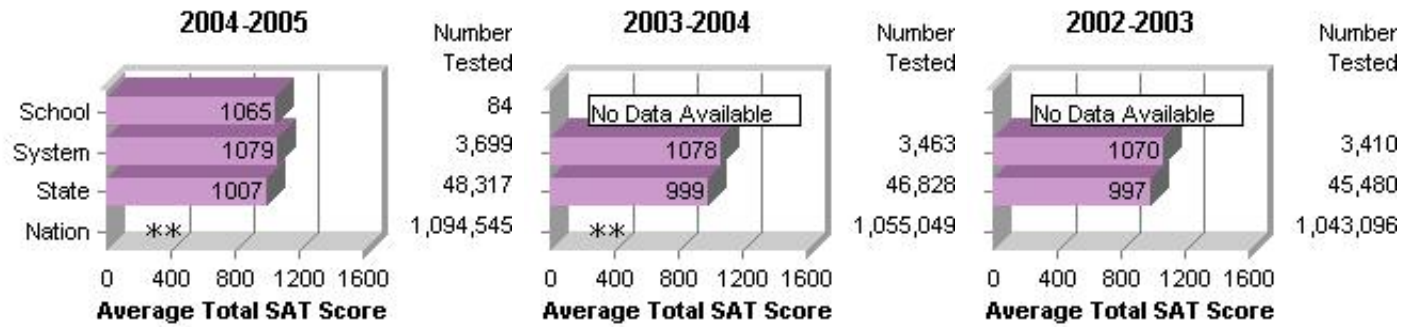
### Average Math SAT Score for High School Seniors (Reflects Most Recent Scores) at the State and National Levels



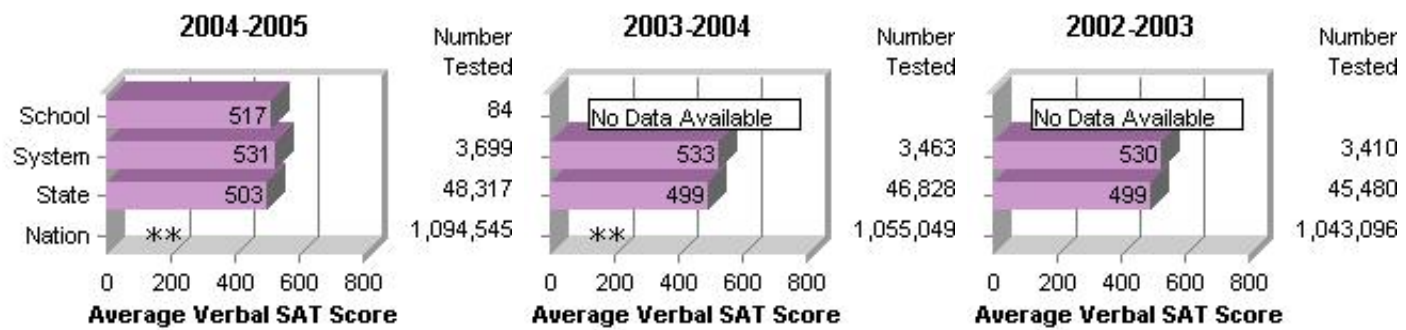
### Average Math SAT Score for High School Seniors by Subgroups (Reflects Most Recent Scores) at the State and National Levels



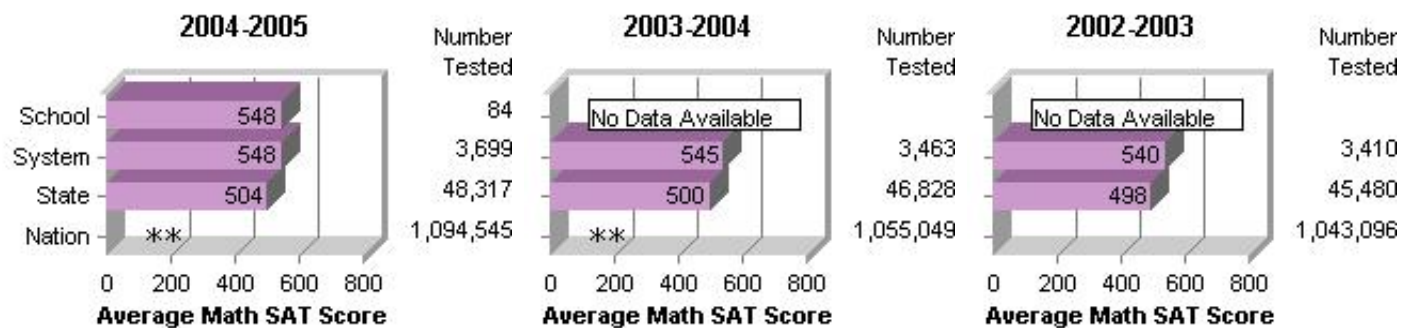
**Average Total SAT Score for High School Seniors

at the State and National Levels**



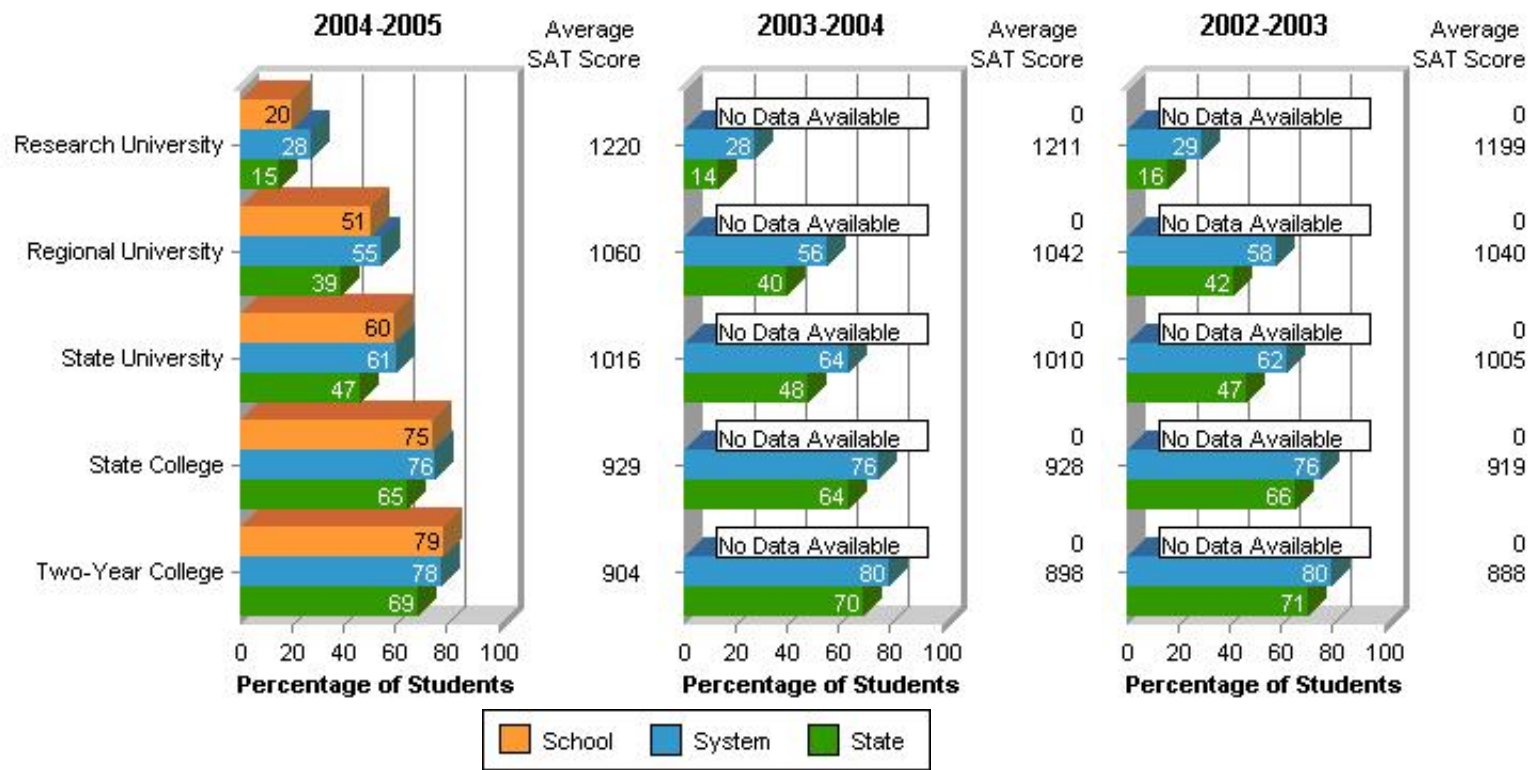
**Average Verbal SAT Score for High School Seniors
